What is "One Health Master"?

"One Health Master" is the person who is able to teach the basics of One Health (philosophy, history, current status) to practical examples of One Health initiatives, and is actively involved in promoting awareness of One Health.

First, program participants gave presentations on "What I want to tell about One Health" at the venue.

Afterwards, a ceremony was held to celebrate the completion of the program for those who have been certified as One Health Masters.

The paper for the certificate is made of environmentally friendly banana paper.

[Banana Paper]

This "fair trade" paper is made from "banana fiber" taken from organic banana stalks, which until now had only been discarded, and recycled paper or certified forest pulp is added.
