FAVA President Kurauchi concluded his speech with the following remarks

In the Asian region, where there is a high risk of outbreaks of zoonoses, it is very important for us, veterinarians and physicians, to work together to prepare for new zoonoses. And in addition to zoonosis, there are an extremely wide range of areas where veterinarians' expertise is needed, such as the global problem of drug-resistant bacteria, preservation of ecosystems, and stable food supply through improved productivity of livestock products.

These global issues cannot be solved by a single country alone and must be addressed through international collaboration.

I believe that the network of the Federation of Asian Veterinary Associations (FAVA), a federation of veterinary associations in Asia and Oceania, will play a major role. With the strong network of FAVA, I would like to contribute not only to the development of the veterinary community but also to the building of a better society.
